Armstrong County 9-1-1 works in conjunction with the Armstrong County Department of Public Safety and the Sheriff's Office along with 18 police departments, 34 fire companies and 13 ambulance services to provide safety and assistance to Armstrong County citizens. The center also assists other county agencies with after-hours emergencies.



When to call...



- When there is a medical emergency
- When there is a fire
- When people or property are in danger
- When a person is creating a situation that could cause harm or danger to themselves or another person or property
- For downed power lines
- For downed trees that create a traffic hazard
- For vehicle accidents

When <u>not</u> to call...



- To report utility outages before attempting to reach a utility company.
- To inquire about fireworks, parades, or other community events
- About addressing issues, those need to be handled by the addressing department
- For a telephone number that is not related to emergency services
- For a non-emergency ambulance transports such as doctor appointments, return home trips, etc.
- School closings, road closures, etc. This information is usually available on the internet.
